

Paddle Canada Level Flatwater Instructor

This course is designed for individuals wanting to become professional sea kayak instructors and join a national standard of instructors across Canada. This 3-day, sea kayak Flatwater Instructor program provides an opportunity to test the knowledge and skills necessary to becoming a Flatwater Instructor for Paddle Canada.

The course demands your full attention and commitment. The course is an ongoing assessment with a focus on the art of teaching on land and on the water.

Program Objectives

- ❑ Develop the skills necessary to organize and teach a 1-day sea kayak beginner course.
- ❑ Develop and practice your own skills set.
- ❑ Become familiar with Paddle Canada's administrative procedures and protocols.
- ❑ Develop and practice leadership skills, risk assessment and safety management, decision making, applying judgment, group management and general seamanship.



The Details

This instructor course will help guide you over a 3-day period.

In particular, successful candidates for this award will be able to:

- ❑ Consistently self-rescue with confidence
- ❑ Clearly and confidently communicate with groups of participants in a teaching environment
- ❑ Prepare and organize on land and on water kayak related classes
- ❑ Create lesson plans, with objectives and learning outcomes
- ❑ Demonstrate paddling skills as required of a Flatwater instructor

A minimum of 3 candidates is required to run this program. The final decision to run a course will be made 30 days in advance. The ratio is one instructor for 6 participants.

The evaluation will comprise of continual ongoing assessment throughout the class and a final written and practical evaluation.

The fees do not include Paddle Canada membership, immersion gear, personal equipment, or a kayak.

You will need:

- ❑ Touring kayak
- ❑ PFD
- ❑ Paddle
- ❑ Pump
- ❑ 15 meter buoyancy heaving device
- ❑ Tow line
- ❑ Spray skirt
- ❑ Whistle
- ❑ Immersion clothing (for extended periods of time)

A deposit of \$200 is required to secure your spot. No refunds will be issued within 30 days before the start of the program. The balance is due 30 days before the start of the program. Please send your deposit (cheque, money order or cash) to SKILS, Box 727, Ucluelet, BC, V0R 3A0



The Weather

The weather is variable at all times on the west coast; over the 5 days we can expect sun, rain, and wind in varying amounts. Please come prepared. You will also spend a good deal of time in the water during rescue practice and scenarios. The water temperature varies from

6°Celsius to 15°Celsius. Bring lots of clothing and immersion gear.

Meals

You are responsible for all meals during the program. Participants are encouraged to bring extra snacks to fill in the holes and satisfy personal tastes.

Prerequisites:

- ❑ 16 years of age
- ❑ Basic First Aid
- ❑ CPR Level C
- ❑ Paddle Canada Level 1 Skills Award
- ❑ Candidates must have Paddle Canada Level 1 Skills certification prior to take the program.

Evacuation Policy

Occasionally, we will need to evacuate a participant from the program due to health or behavioral concerns; in this event, you are responsible for all costs associated with the evacuation. Depending on the urgency of the situation, we will either arrange for transportation through local resources or through the Canadian Coast Guard. Travel and personal insurance is always recommended.
